TURNING WASTE WATER INTO WONDERFUL WATER

At the Agricultural Pavilion, Sequater (South-East Queensland Water) are showing visitors how we can reuse water to help with the drought.

Sequater is responsible for providing a safe, secure and cost-effective drinking water supply across South-East Queensland. This is becoming more challenging during times of climate change and drought.

One of the activities at the Sequater stand is the Augmented Reality Sandpit, where you learn how different industries recycle water. Visitors do this by placing houses and different water factories near dams.

"Our Augmented Sandpit is to get people to understand how we move water around," said Michael Fiechtner, from Seqwater.

Visitors can also visit the Sippidy-do-bar, where there are samples of Saltless Sparkling Seawater and flavoured iced teas that had been made from desalinated sea water.

There is a competition

where you must sing a song to get a chance to win a waterproof shower speaker.

They also have a Spotify playlist which has forty water-based songs that are no longer than four minutes in length to encourage people to reduce their shower times.

There are also free water refills of desalinated seawater.

"What we're doing here is educating people. We want the community to understand what it is about water that is important."
