The RACQ Animal Nursery brings the country to the city, allowing visitors to pat, photograph, learn about and interact with a variety of cute and cuddly farm animals.

There are pigs, llamas, alpacas, donkeys, dairy cows, calves, sheep, goats and chickens featured at the Nursery. Ponies, puppies, chicks, ducks, ducklings and a miniature horse can also be seen.
