David Manchon, a Brisbane raised horse rider and trainer, is performing the Brumby Run each night in the Main Arena to entertain the crowds.

The show is inspired by Banjo Paterson's poem, the Brumby Run, and includes 55 horses, miniature ponies and a young female trick rider.

David grew up in Brisbane city, so he didn't have much access to horses and buying a horse was too expensive for his family. To pursue his passion, he had to work for free to learn from horse riders and trainers in the country.

41-year-old David has spent most of his life learning about horse riding and has been riding horses professionally for 20 years but has always loved them.

"In horses, its generally a life long career path. (It) takes a long time to learn and train these animals, so we're always learning and I'm grateful to be where I'm at," said David.

David trains his horses by gaining trust during practices everyday. After that he starts to introduce skills and tricks.

Before a show he takes care of the essentials for horses and makes sure there're happy. Comfort is the most important thing to David when it comes to preparation.

His favourite horse, Rocy, has been with him for 18 years and David loves his beautiful mind and sweet nature.
