

"I think it's really really important that everybody knows how to do CPR. It's a life saving skill. 95% of cardiac arrests occur in the home, so, the likelihood is if we ever have to do CPR, it's going to be on someone we know and love," said Mrs Molyneux.

Mrs Molyneux has been working in medical studies for 18 years. She started with a Diploma of Paramedicine before moving on to degree level. She was inspired to be a paramedic from her aunty who thought she would be good at it.

Mrs Molyneux said that she enjoys being a paramedic because she likes helping the community and getting out and talking to people.

"I think just it's a bit of fun for everyone to come down and have a race doing CPR. We like seeing all the friendly faces, so everybody needs to come down and see us," said Mrs Molyneux.
