## YOUNG JUDGING

On Tuesday 9 August, the Fine Arts classes of the Young Judges Competition were held.

The classes included Leatherwork, Contemporary Cake Decoration, China Painting and Photography.

Young Judges need to judge four entries from a competition that had previously been judged, and place them in order from first to fourth. They then need to justify their placements by discussing

the characteristics of each entry and give reasons for their decision. The competitor who is in closest agreement with the main or over-judge is the winner of the competition.

Anabelle Thorley won first place for the Young Judges Contemporary Cake Decoration competition.

Anabelle said that her decision was based on her belief that the decoration had to be detailed and

that the decorator must be skilled with the tools they used. “We have to talk about the level of difficulty, skill, the colour, and the originality of the cake, so it can't just be like any other cake,” she said.

The winner of the China Painting class, Eve Chamberlain, thought it was a great experience.

“I enjoyed making the speech to the over-judge. I think that it was quite thrilling,” she said.

Other winners in this competition were Brooke Emery for Leatherwork and Annabelle Thorley for Photography.

Eve Chamberlain received the award for the Most Successful Competitor in Fine Arts.
